



# ACTION STEPS

## LAUNCHING A COMMUNITY ON MISSION



#### **STATISTICAL REPORTS - CENSUS, STATE, BARNA, PERCEPT, ETC.**

- Analyze / exegete your neighborhood / city by reading about its economic, social, political and demographic structure on Wikipedia or your city's website.
- Some denominational organizations have faith statistics available.
- Reports like Percept may have a cost associated with them. These types of reports do allow for a drill down by zip code, radius around a given location, or for map specific areas that can be custom designed.

#### **COMMUNITY ON MISSION TEAM**

- Canvas within the church body to determine what has God placed on the hearts of congregants you may already have.
- Come up with a list of potential Community on Mission leaders.
- Recruit a Community Leader.
- Recruit a Mission Leader.
- Have the new Community on Mission leaders go through the onboarding class.
- Together with the Community on Mission Leaders, decide on a clear mission.
- Meet with the Community on Mission leaders to brainstorm and come up with a timeline for the launch.
- Make connection with the place where the missional outreach will take place.
- Make a list with your leaders of potential core group members.
- Recruit core group members.
- Recruit team members. These can be people in the community that have a passion around the mission the Community on Mission will address, regardless of where they are on their life journey.
- Spend a weekend with the team members / go on a retreat with all of them.
- Set a date for the first launch meeting.
- Set a date for the first mission outreach.
- Determine which Bible study will be used in the Community Gatherings on the alternate weeks of service.
- Announce in the church that a new Community on Mission is starting.
- Pray for the potential leaders and the launch of the next new Community on Mission.
